REFUSE COLLECTION DURING THE CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR'S HOLIDAYS

All garbage and recycling pick-up will be one day late the weeks of December 26, 2011, and January 2, 2012, in observance of the Christmas and New Year's holiday. The normal collection schedule will resume the week of January 9, 2012.

City Hall will also be closed, Monday, December 26, 2011, in observance of the Christmas holiday and Monday, January 2, 2012, in observance of the New Year's holiday.

On Monday, December 26, 2011, and Monday, January 2, 2012, the parking decks will be free of charge and there will be no enforcement of the parking meters.

For those who will have a real Christmas tree, set it out after Christmas at your normal pick-up location (curb or alley) on your regular trash day for pick up. Christmas trees will be collected until January 31, 2012.
